

# **EMERGENCY GRANTS**

**PURPOSE**: To provide up to \$20,000 in grant support to businesses facing hardship due to qualifying events such as fire, natural disaster, extreme acts of physical vandalism, utility failure, or a highly disruptive public works project.

#### FUNDING PRIORITIES

- Small/Micro business owners that have been historically undercapitalized and cannot withstand a prolonged loss of revenue
- Annual revenue is less than \$500,000

## **BUSINESS ELIGIBILITY CHECKLIST**

- □ Located in Philadelphia
- □ Independently owned and operated
- □ Operates a storefront or physical location (food trucks and kiosks are eligible)
- □ Is in compliance with all federal, state, and local taxes (or on an approved payment plan)
- □ Has the required federal, state, and local licenses and permits to operate legally
- □ Must be able to show a financial need for the potential grant
- □ If closed due to emergency, must have the intention to reopen
- □ Can provide evidence (e.g. photos) of physical losses or damages, as relevant
- □ Non-profits are ineligible

## WHAT YOU'LL NEED TO APPLY:

- □ Basic information about your business, such as:
  - Type of business
  - Annual revenues
  - Debt schedule
  - Number of employees
- □ Description of emergency/damage & photos
- □ Signed W-9 for business
- □ Most recently filed **federal tax return**

## **DECISION-MAKING PROCESS**

- Applications are reviewed weekly by The Merchants Fund and Philadelphia Department of Commerce
- Funding decisions will generally be made within 2-3 weeks of submission
  - Timeline based upon applicant's response time to potential follow-up questions

#### OTHER THINGS TO KNOW



- You can contact the Office of Business Services for help with an application and for translation services in any language, including but not limited to:
  - o Arabic
  - Cambodian (Khmer)
  - Chinese (Mandarin & Cantonese)
  - o French
- A strong application will:
  - Clearly demonstrate the need for a grant
  - Clearly explain the plan for how a grant will be used, including short-term and long-term goals for stabilization or recovery
- Common reasons applications are **<u>not</u>** funded include:
  - the applicant knowingly withholds important information or is not truthful
  - the application is incomplete and/or does not provide the required information
  - the applicant does not demonstrate the ability to be able to re-open
  - the applicant does not demonstrate the need for a grant
